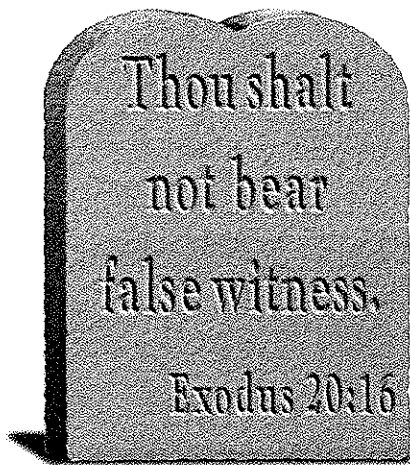




Buying the Truth
